Are You Experiencing a Relationship Wedge?

Dr. Gary Chapman, author of *The Five Love Languages*, describes a relationship wedge as anything that has the potential to push you away from someone you care about. The first and most dangerous wedge is pride. Specifically, the kind of pride that keeps you from apologizing or making the first move in resolving conflict. Pride is what turns simple misunderstandings into long-term problems.

Other potential wedges to watch out for include negative input and gossip, an overbooked schedule, and indifference. If you are experiencing multiple relationship wedges you may not be able to remove all of them immediately, but you can start to remove them one by one in order to give your relationship a chance to grow.


